

“Becoming Unstoppable” - Teachers’ Guide

Becoming Unstoppable is a fun and easy way for your students to learn the success principles that will help them both in school and in life.

- 1 - Play the 2-4 minute video. Have the video question sheet with you.
- 2 - Ask as many questions as your time permits. Feel free to improvise by using your own questions. The goal is for your students to have fun as they learn the principles.
- 3 - Some of the questions in the Teacher’s Guide will be labeled (Pair and Share).
Use the Pair and Share technique whenever you see fit.

How to Get Your Students to Participate More in Class Discussions

Think-Pair-Share is a simple and very effective technique that’s been around since the early 80s. It’s natural and doesn’t take much preparation.

Simply ask an open ended question and tell your students to think about the answer for a few moments.

Then have your students pair up and give them each 30 seconds to tell each other the answer. **Let them know when the 30 seconds are up** so they can switch from talking to listening and vice-versa. This helps the listeners focus on listening.

Walk around the room to make sure they’re on the right track. You’ll know your students are getting excited as they begin to speak faster and louder and when the tones of their voices begin to go up and down instead of being just a low, steady tone.

Finally, in an encouraging way, get them to share.

“Show of hands. Who’s got something interesting to share? Let’s hear about it!”

TPS helps your more reserved students speak up because after getting positive feedback when sharing their answer to one student, they feel safer about sharing to the whole class.
